

And this is the story of how they first met . . .

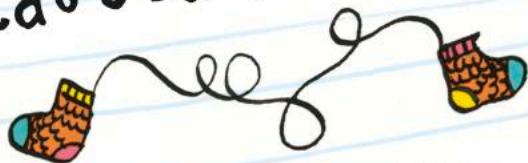




Chapter One Meet Cat

Woolly pirate costume.



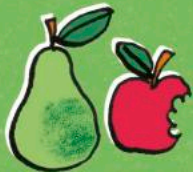
Knitted tennis equipment

crunchy sandwiches).


A baby beanstalk
